Our History

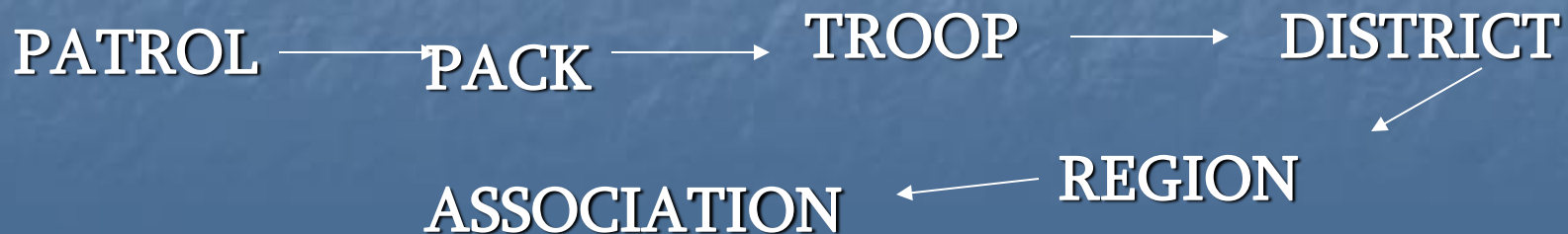
- 1910-First Hungarian scout camp
